

DIRECTIONS

When traveling from:

- <u>Points North:</u> Take I-81 south to Route 104; follow Route 104 west through Oswego to campus.
- <u>Points East:</u> Take I-90 (New York State Thruway) west to Exit 34A (vicinity of Syracuse). Proceed north on Route 481 through Fulton to Route 104 in Oswego. Follow Route 104 west to campus.
- <u>Points South:</u> Take Route I-81 north to Exit 16A (Syracuse). Proceed north on Route 481 through Fulton, to Route 104 in Oswego. Follow Route 104 west to campus.
- <u>Points West:</u> Take I-90 (New York State Thruway) east to Exit 40 (Weedsport). Travel north on Route 34 to Route 104, then east on Route 104 to campus. Or take Route 104 east directly to campus.
