1. Geographic areas & institutions

- Coastal (land or water)
- Great Lakes (Lake Ontario, eastern Lake Erie, St. Lawrence River)
- Marine district (Long Island Sound, south shore estuaries, Peconic Bays, NY Harbor, tidal Hudson River)

- NYSG is a cooperative program of SUNY and Cornell
- But all universities and colleges in NY are equally eligible
- Other groups, see p.4 of Call

2. What is considered research

YES

- Hypothesis based
- Answer how or why, not just what is
- Developmental work on new methods, models, tools, techniques
- State-of-knowledge synthesis efforts
- Sufficient intellectual content to make it appropriate for university research

NO

- Solely monitoring or survey efforts
- Efforts that are primarily demonstration projects
- Development of understanding only for its own sake

3. Eligible topics and disciplines

- See NYSG's Goals starting on page 3 of the Call
- The research topics are 1.1 thru 7.1
- The keys are
 - to address one of the *listed* research topics
 - structure the project and specific question so it will help NYSG achieve the Goal for that research topic
- "Community" can be any group of people or stakeholders
- Wide variety of research topics
- Biology, chemistry, physical oceanography, engineering, and the social sciences
- Also included: social science research to develop approaches or methods that will aid decision-makers in taking action based on scientifically sound research results

4. Importance of products & impacts

- Peer reviewed publications are expected
- But more than that is also required
 - Who is the target audience for your results? (not just other researchers)
 - What products (models, techniques, information transfer) will your project contribute?
 - Specifically, how will your results help NYSG achieve the Goals listed in the Call? What impact will your work have? Give examples!!
- Preference will be given to high-quality submissions designed to lead to products and knowledge of significance to NYSG Extension staff and their stakeholders

5. Budget info

- Budget cap is \$130K per year, for up to 2 years
- This must include direct + indirect costs
- Pre-proposal should have realistic estimate
- No full breakdown is required for preproposals
- 50% non-federal cost share is required

6. Submission requirements

- Deadline is 4:30 PM EST on Friday February 22
- Submission must be via NYSG's website www.NYSGProposal.org
- Campus sign-offs are not required by NYSG for pre-proposals
- Single pdf file make sure it is PC-readable
- Early submission is strongly advised
- There will be no exceptions to the deadline

7. Review process

Pre-proposals

- Screened by NYSG staff, panel of PAC, academics
- Fit to the Call and significance of the specific issue
- Expected products and impacts
- Likelihood that approach will be successful

Full Proposals

 Similar to pre-proposal with addition of technical peer review and Technical Panel

Outcomes for NYSG's overall ~\$1M per year

- 14-20 pre-proposals to be invited as full proposals
- 7-10 full proposals to be funded

8. Timeline

- Jan 4, 2013 Call released
- Feb 22, 4:30 PM deadline for pre-proposal submission
- April 11 selected PIs invited to write full proposals
- June 7 deadline for full proposal submission
- July 31 Pls receive masked peer reviews for response
- Aug 7 deadline for response to reviews
- Feb 1, 2014 start date of successful proposals

9. Contact NYSG staff

- The list of staff is in the Call
- To make sure you are addressing the most critical questions
- To improve your understanding of what info and products may be the most useful to stakeholders
- To potentially assist you during the pre-proposal and proposal stages, as well as during and after the project
- To answer any questions about the Call

10. Regional or multi-program proposals

- You may include non-NY researchers
- Consider
 - approaching their SG program for funding
 - Submitting under the Special Regional Call for the Northeast Sea Grant Consortium (ME thru NY)
 - Submitting under the Special Regional Call for Mid-Atlantic Sea Grant Programs (NY thru NC)
