ADA-Compliant Bait Station

Friends of the East River Esplanade constructed the *El Barrio Bait Station*, enabling anglers along the East Harlem Esplanade to clean and safely handle their catch, and use the guide to identify common fish. The ADAcompliant prototype designed by Jacobschang Architecture uses solar power to accommodate anglers who fish after dark, and a pump to supply non-potable water to clean catch. Recipient of the 2020 MASterworks Architecture Design for Park Amenities Award, and 2021 American Institute of Architects (AIA) NYS Excelsior Award in acknowledgment of its impact in the community and design excellence.
