

Basic Travel Tips & Resources for Crossing Between Canada & NY's Seaway Trail by Land & Water

Carry Proper Identification - Acceptable Documents include:

One of the following:

- U.S. or Canadian Passport is expected to be required by June 1, 2009

- U.S. Passport Card: limited to land and water travel in Western Hemisphere
- Trusted Traveler Card: NEXUS (accepted as passport alternative), SENTRI (southern border), FAST (commercial trucking)
- Enhanced Drivers License issued by state or province

- Mexican citizens, including children, must present valid passport and B-1/B-2 nonimmigrant visa or Border Crossing Card

OR until expected change date of June 1, 2009, two of the following in combination: one ID document:

- Drivers license or ID card issued by federal, state, provincial, county, territory or municipal authority
- U.S. or Canadian Military ID

and one citizenship document:

- U.S. or Canadian birth certificate original or copy issued by federal, state, provincial, county, territory or municpal authority
- U.S. Consular Report of Birth Abroad
- U.S. Certificate of Naturalization
- U.S. Certificate of Citizenship
- U.S. Citizen ID Card
- Canadian Citizenship Card
- Canadian Certificate of Citizenship without photo

Child ID: Children ages 18 & younger must present original or certified-copy birth certificate issued by federal, state, provincial, county, territory or municpal authority

Parents should carry proof of joint custody of your children and a notarized letter of permission w/phone # for parent(s) of children not your own



NEXUS for Frequent Trusted Travelers to U.S. and Canada by Land, Sea and Air

- NEXUS expedites northern cross-border processing for approved motorists, boaters and air travelers
- Motorists and air travelers may use dedicated lanes at designated land and airports of entry into US & Canada; current highway locations include Peace and Rainbow bridges & NEXUS-only Whirlpool Bridge.
 NEXUS for air travel requires iris ID scan
- Approved boaters may report arrival by phone into US (800-827-2851) and Canada (866-99NEXUS)
- Card costs \$50 US/\$50 CAN, good for five years, replaces I-68 for qualified travelers; no fee for children under 18; requires photos, fingerprints & iris capture at designated in-person processing centers
- NEXUS cardholders remain subject to random inspection and declarations

One-Year I-68 and Five-Year CANPASS Permits for Recreational Boaters

 I-68 permit holders must carry proper identity and citizenship ID documents to report arrival in U.S. at
- Seaway Trail ports by phone (800-827-2851); children younger than 14 can be listed on parent's I-68
- I-68 permit costs \$16 US per individual, \$32 US per family; and is good for one year (CANPASS and NEXUS are good for 5 years; CANPASS fee is \$40 for each applicant 18 and older)
- Boaters remain subject to random inspection and declarations

Boaters with Neither I-68 or NEXUS (info above): Report for in-person inspection upon each arrival at nearest open marine port of entry (along Seaway Trail: Heart Island: May 10 into Oct, 10a-6p, 315-482-5901; Cape Vincent: May 1 into Oct, 8a-8p, 315-654-2781) **OR** report arrival by videophone in US and Canada

Reporting Information: Name • birthdate • citizenship • passport number (as appropriate) of master & all aboard • boat name & registration number • home port • current location • contact information • for boats 30 feet or longer: US Decal Number (decal info: 317-298-1300x1245,www.cbp.gov/xp/cgovtravel/pleasure_boats/user_fee_decal.xml) Only master of the boat or one designee may go ashore to report arrival; if using I-68 or NEXUS, all remaining aboard must have permits or cards

Trailering Your Boat Across: Carry proof of ownership for boat, trailer and towing vehicle; all vehicles should be in safe, approved working order: check Motor Vehicle regulations for both US and Canada

Health Insurance: Some health insurance policies do not cover health care services in Canada

Traveling with Pets: Owners may generally travel with healthy pets with current rabies and vaccination certificates

Before you travel, use the resources above to learn how to make proper declaration of goods and activities at the border crossings. There may be forms to complete to declare certain types or amounts of goods/gift items. For example, high value items should be declared before leaving U.S. or Canada; and more than \$10,000 in monetary instruments (cash, traveler's checks, money orders) must be declared upon entering or leaving US & Canada.

Restrictions on length of stay apply to amounts of goods/gifts that you can import on your return trip. Some declarations can be made by phone or using NEXUS lanes, others will require in-person reporting, use of regular lanes and duty charges. For example, if arriving by boat in U.S. or Canada, all aboard must be NEXUS cardholders in order to use NEXUS telephone system to declare goods.


